Pee Wee Pioneers FAQ

Q:Where do I drop off my child for camp?

A: Pee Wee Camp takes place in the Preschool Wing of DPCC. The door is located just north of the main doors at DPCC. There will be a sign in front of the door indicating "Pee Wee Pioneers Drop Off."

Q: What does my child need to bring to camp?

A: A list will be posted on class dojo by the camp coordinator. It is also listed in the Parent Handbook which is posted on the Day Camp page of the website, lockportpark.org.

Q: When does my child get their camp shirt?

A: Camp shirts will be placed in children's bags the first day of camp.

Q: Does the Pee Wee Camp swim?

A: No, but they do plan a water day on the last day of each session. This is simply water play just outside of the preschool playground.

Q: Does my child need to be toilet trained to participate in Pee Wee Camp?

A: Yes, however children can come to camp in a pull-up as long as a parent/caregiver is available to come back to the building to change the child when needed.

Q: Are the Pee Wee Counselors able to help the children in the bathroom?

A: Our staff members are able to help minimally in the bathroom with pulling down/up pants and underwear. It is best to dress children in clothing that makes it easy for them to pull down/up their pants/shorts when using the toilet. Staff are also not able to wipe children once they have used the toilet. Please practice this skill at home.

Q: Who should I notify if my child is going to be late to camp?

A: Message your child's camp counselors on class dojo if your child will be late, or if you will be picking up early. You may need to meet the camp outside the building if you drop off late. Weekly schedules will be posted on class dojo so it will be easy to determine where your child's camp is at any given time.

Q: Should sunscreen be applied before dropping off at camp?

A: Yes, it will be reapplied by staff as needed. The only kind of sunscreen that staff can apply is the spray sunscreen. Please be sure that it is packed in your child's bag.

Q: Do the Pee Wee Camp Groups spend time outdoors?

A: Yes, about ½ of their day is spent outside, weather permitting. If the temperature is extremely hot or humid, outdoor time will be limited and water play activities will be made available.
